PROBABLE CAUSE STATEMENT

I, Special Agent Nicholas A. Brown, declare under penalty of perjury that the following is true and correct:

On August 8, 2018 at about 2:30 am, Fernando Jesus PERAZA (PERAZA), a United States Citizen, attempted to enter the United States at the San Ysidro, California, Port of Entry. PERAZA was the driver and sole occupant of a black Audi TT Quattro bearing a California license plate.

While assigned to vehicle preprimary, a U.S. Customs and Border Protection (CBP) Officer made contact with PERAZA and received two negative Customs declarations. Due to the high readings from a K910 Buster device, the vehicle was referred to secondary inspection.

A CBP Officer was assigned to conduct an x-ray scan of the black Audi TT Quattro and observed anomalies in the passenger side rear quarter panel.

A CBP Canine Enforcement Officer (CEO) was assigned to conduct K-9 operations and observed the Narcotics and Human Detection Dog (NHDD) alert to the presence of a trained odor emanating from the black Audi TT Quarttro.

A CBP Officer was assigned to conduct a secondary inspection of the vehicle. The CBP Officer conducted a 7 - point inspection of the black Audi TT Quattro and found four packages concealed inside the passenger side rear quarter panel. Four packages containing over 20,000 pills containing fentanyl were found.

On August 8, 2018, at approximately 7:55 a.m., HSI Special Agents interviewed PERAZA. PERAZA agreed to waive his Miranda rights and speak with agents. During the interview, PERAZA made several statements including his admission that he knew there were drugs in his vehicle, but claimed that he participated in the drug smuggling incident because his family was threatened. He claimed that he was getting paid \$1,000 to smuggle the drugs.
