THE DEFENDANT SHALL SUBMIT TO AN INITIAL INSPECTION BY THE U.S. PROBATION OFFICE AND TO ANY EXAMINATIONS DURING SUPERVISION OF HIS COMPUTER AND ANY DEVICES, PROGRAMS, OR APPLICATIONS. THE DEFENDANT SHALL ALLOW INSTALLATION OF ANY HARDWARE OR SOFTWARE SYSTEMS WHICH MONITOR OR FILTER COMPUTER USE. THE DEFENDANT SHALL ABIDE BY THE STANDARD CONDITIONS OF COMPUTER MONITORING AND FILTERING THAT WILL BE APPROVED BY THIS COURT.
