California, November - December 2022

It is almost impossible to summarize the counterfeit medicine news in California. Fake pills made to look like legitimate prescription pills are being seized on a nearly daily basis around the state. Incidents of students being poisoned by fentanyl have left <u>schools stocking up on</u> <u>naloxone</u>. In addition to fentanyl pills, recent cases also involved fake Adderall pills that were made of methamphetamine and fake Xanax made of N-Ethylhexedrone.

Dangerous fake medicine has found its way into California from places other than street corners or social media apps. Sometimes, members of the medical profession have purchased medicine from unlicensed sources. Between 2012 and 2016, the U.S. Food and Drug Administration sent letters to 516 doctors and medical practices across California warning them to stop buying medicine from known black market wholesalers. These letters referenced medicines to treat serious medical conditions such as cancer and osteoporosis. In 2021, ten individuals and companies in California were named in a lawsuit filed by Gilead Sciences alleging their participation in a massive counterfeit HIV medication trafficking ring.
