

Missouri, July 2022 - January 2023

Articles about fake pills made with fentanyl have dominated the counterfeit medicine news out of Missouri since mid-2022. Oak Grove saw four high school-aged students poisoned by fentanyl pills, one of whom died. Both the Kansas City, Missouri Police Department and the DEA St. Louis Field Division reported seizing record amounts of fentanyl pills. Additional cases linked to fentanyl pill deaths were reported in Ozark, Belton, and Atchison County.

Dangerous fake medicine has found its way into Missouri from places other than street corners or social media apps. Sometimes, members of the medical profession have purchased medicine from unlicensed sources. Between 2012 and 2016, the U.S. Food and Drug Administration sent letters to 39 doctors and medical practices across Missouri warning them to stop buying medicine from known black market wholesalers. These letters were in reference to cancer medications and Botox. More recently, a man running a medical spa in Kansas City pleaded guilty to ordering illegitimate Botox and a cosmetic injectable from Alibaba, and at least ten of his patients were hurt by these injections. Also, a doctor was sentenced after injecting patients for nearly a decade with a non-FDA-approved arthritis drug.

January 2023
