

Nebraska, September 2020 – January 2023

The Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA) announced at the end of December that they had seized nearly 4.7 million lethal doses of fentanyl in their Omaha Division which covers South Dakota, North Dakota, Iowa, Nebraska and Minnesota. The DEA warns that much of the fentanyl is trafficked as fake prescription pills. DEA laboratory testing in 2022 showed that six out of ten fake pills contained a potentially lethal dose. The Centers for Disease Control and Prevent reported that 256 Nebraskans died from poisonings and overdoses on fentanyl and other synthetic opioids between 2018 and 2022. All of Nebraska law enforcement seized 46 fentanyl pills in 2019, 4,000 in 2020, but in 2021 83,000 were seized by the DEA alone. By July 2022, the DEA seized more than 151,000 pills in Nebraska.

In addition to these counterfeits, between 2012 and 2016 the U.S. Food and Drug Administration warned six Nebraska doctors to stop purchasing medication from black market sellers of specious medicine for cancer, osteoporosis, migraines and other serious medical conditions.
