

Rhode Island, February 2022 - February 2023

The counterfeit medicine news out of Rhode Island over the past year paints a grim picture of the dangers posed to residents of the state. Police have seized fake prescription pain pills made with fentanyl and fake Adderall made with methamphetamine. Even more disturbing is the news that criminals are using pill presses to make their own pills for distribution. In just one case, law enforcement seized over 660,000 counterfeit Adderall pills made with methamphetamine from a Cumberland resident who had two pill presses.

Dangerous fake medicine has found its way into Rhode Island from places other than street corners or social media apps. The state has seen residents illegally importing and reselling steroids and prescription drugs, including cancer treatments. Sometimes, members of the medical profession have purchased medicine from unlicensed sources. Between 2012 and 2016, the U.S. Food and Drug Administration sent letters to six doctors and medical practices across Rhode Island warning them to stop buying medicine from known black market wholesalers.
