
# Wyoming's fake pill problem is growing





## FENTANYL WAS SLOW TO GET A GRIP ON WYOMING, BUT COUNTERFEIT PILL INCIDENTS HAVE INCREASED SHARPLY IN RECENT YEARS.

Wyoming reported the confirmed **counterfeit pill death of a Cheyenne resident** in February 2021, and a wave of at least **five fatal fentanyl poisonings in Gillette** between December 2019 and June 2020. Law enforcement has made **fentanyl pill seizures in Cheyenne, Gillette and Sublette County** since the beginning of 2020. These incidents followed **kilogram-size seizures of fentanyl powder** in April 2018 and May 2019, and the **near-death of a woman in Worland** who took a fake oxycodone made with fentanyl in August 2018.



February 2021, Cheyenne: A resident died after taking a counterfeit fentanyl pill.



October 2020, Gillette: The Division of Criminal Investigation seized almost 1,400 fake oxycodone pills made with fentanyl from a resident's home.



May 2019, Laramie County: Wyoming Highway Patrol seized a kilogram of fentanyl among other illicit drugs during a traffic stop.

### Black market medicine has also made its way into Wyoming.



Between 2012 and 2016, the FDA warned nine Wyoming doctors to stop buying oncology drugs and Botox from unlicensed sellers that had been caught selling counterfeits.



In 2018, U.S. Customs and Border Protection caught a Torrington woman importing tapentadol tablets from India and two Riverton residents smuggling steroids from China.

# COUNTERFEIT AND BLACK MARKET DRUG INCIDENTS IN WYOMING, 2013-2021

BASED ON REPORTED INVESTIGATIONS.

#### FENTANYL AND FENTANYL PILLS

February 2021: A Cheyenne man was arrested for allegedly receiving and distributing a large shipment of fentanyl pills, including

 $those \ that \ caused \ the \ poisoning \ death \ of \ Harrison \ Jacknitsky \ on \ February \ 20, 2021. \ Police \ found \ 16 \ grams \ of \ suspected$ 

oxycodone and/or fentanyl pills, among other drugs, when they searched his apartment.

January 2021: An Idaho man was arrested for bringing counterfeit oxycodone pills made with fentanyl into Sublette County.

October 2020: Prosecutors in the sentencing phase against fentanyl pill kingpin Aaron Shamo stated in a court document that the

defendant shipped fake fentanyl pills to every single state.<sup>3</sup>

 $\textbf{October 2020:} \qquad \text{Wyoming Division of Criminal Investigation found almost 1,400 counterfeit oxycodone pills made with fentanyl in the} \\$ 

home of Gillette resident Joseph Laray Speigelmyer. Speigelmyer pleaded guilty to drug charges in March 2021.4

July 2020: The Wyoming Division of Criminal Investigation found 121 fentanyl pills in the home of Matthew Skipper, a Gillette

resident who they later filed charges against in September 2020. Skipper pleaded guilty in September 2020.

June 2020: The Campbell County Coroner announced that a Gillette resident who had died of fentanyl poisoning on May 11 was

the city's fifth fentanyl-related death since December 2019.

May 2019: The Wyoming Highway Patrol seized a kilogram of fentanyl and more than 25 kilos of other illicit drugs during a traffic

stop in Laramie County. The driver of the vehicle, Arnold D. Butler, was convicted at trial and received a 20-year federal

prison sentence in July 2020.8

**August 2018:** A woman in Worland nearly died of fentanyl poisoning when the oxycodone she purchased from fellow Worland

residents proved to be counterfeit.9

April 2018: Law enforcement seized a kilogram of suspected fentanyl and 16 kilograms of suspected heroin and methamphetamine

while searching a vehicle in Albany County. 10

#### BLACK MARKET AND COUNTERFEIT CANCER DRUGS

**April 2015:** The FDA sent warning letters to two Wyoming doctors and more than 270 nationwide to stop buying drugs from Gallant

Pharmaceuticals, which sold more than 39 non FDA approved medications.<sup>11</sup>

May 2013: The FDA warned 780 medical practices, including two doctors' offices in Wyoming, to stop doing business with

unlicensed drug seller Medical Device King, which had sold 31 non FDA approved medications, including counterfeit

Avastin.12

#### MISBRANDED AND COUNTERFEIT BOTOX

March 2016: The FDA warned four Wyoming doctors and more than 1,200 nationwide to stop buying from Canadian distributor TC

Medical, which sold 22 different kinds of non FDA approved medications, including counterfeit Botox.<sup>13</sup>

July 2013: The FDA warned one medical practice in Wyoming to stop purchasing fraudulent versions of Botox sold by Online

Botox Pharmacy, Onlinebotox.com, and Onlinebotox.14

#### OTHER COUNTERFEIT PRODUCTS

December 2018: A Torrington resident was arrested after U.S. Customs and Border Protection officials intercepted a package of the

opioid tapentadol on its way from India to her house. A search warrant yielded 2,000 tapentadol tablets, along with

oxycodone and fentanyl.15

January 2018: Two Riverton men were charged with "attempting to possess a felony amount of a Schedule III controlled substance"

when U.S. Customs and Border Protection seized a package on its way to them from China that contained a year's

supply of steroids. The shipment had been declared to be beauty products. <sup>16</sup>




