

SUSPICIOUS SALES SURVEILLANCE REPORT

Mar 12, 2026

Criminals have been caught using pharmacy to pharmacy marketplaces to sell **illegally diverted** and **counterfeit medicine** to pharmacies. Deals that appear too good to be true are suspicious.

A survey of **suspicious listings** from the eight leading pharmacy-to-pharmacy drug marketplaces:

Survey conducted the week of March 9, 2026 by PSM partner BC Consulting, which provides marketplace surveillance services.

Online pharmacy-to-pharmacy marketplaces help pharmacies with inventory management, but they also draw criminals selling black market medicines that are a threat to American patients: between 2021 and 2023, two members of a New York drug diversion ring used these platforms to [sell approximately \\$9 million of drugs to unsuspecting pharmacies](#).
